

Celebrating Christmas with Lilliput Lane

Hand made and hand painted in Britain, if there's one thing that Lilliput Lane is admired for — charm and authenticity aside — it's the appealing snowed cottages that it produces each year. Here, we've selected just four of the new festive-inspired pieces on offer from June 2014:

Christmas Deliveries: features a picturesque former post office on the Port Sunlight Estate. Built in 1891, it is a remarkable timber-framed building with an impressive jettied first floor. Today it serves as a café called the Tudor Rose Tea Rooms.

Letters For Christmas: this delightful village post office and stores is situated in the small Aberdeenshire village of Tarves and serves its community well, especially at Christmastime when the little post box in the wall must become very full indeed!

Perfect Time: inspired by Pembridge's magnificent grade-I-listed bell tower at the Church of St Mary. Reminiscent of the stave churches of Norway, what is remarkable about it is that it is detached from the church itself, which is an unusual phenomenon in the UK, but which occurs in seven other churches in Herefordshire.

Christmas Cheer: new to the British Collection, Scotland, this pub called Greyfriars Bobby's Bar is a popular watering hole for tourists who flock to see the statue of Greyfriars Bobby, the faithful Skye terrier who kept guard over his master's grave for fourteen years.

All come in gift box packaging with a deed card which gives information about the real building that inspired the piece.
